Dear brothers and sisters.

In past posts, I referred to the need to pray for vocations and the desire that our community may become a place where our young may find the support, they need to discern this call appropriately.

As we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday and the annual day of prayer for vocations, I would like to point out some truths that should guide our discernment and support of vocations.

These truths are:

-The good Shepherd knows his sheep and the sheep know him. How wonderful and consoling it is to know that Jesus knows us one by one, that for him we are not anonymous persons, that our name is known to him! For Jesus, we are not a "mass," a "multitude"! We are individual "persons" with eternal value, both as creatures and as redeemed persons! He knows us! He knows me and loves me and gave himself for me! (Gal 2:20);

- The Good Shepherd feeds his sheep and leads them to abundant fresh pastures. Jesus came to bring life to souls and give it in superabundance. A soul's life consists of three supreme realities: truth, grace, and glory. Jesus is the truth because he is the Word incarnate. He is the "head of the corner", as St. Peter said to the rulers of the people and elders, the stone on which alone it is possible to construct the family, social, and political edifice: "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:11-12)

Jesus gives us "grace," that is, divine life, through Baptism and the other sacraments. Through "grace," we become participants in God's very Trinitarian nature—an immense mystery but of inexpressible joy and consolation!

Jesus, finally, will give us the glory of Paradise, complete and eternal glory, where we will be loved and will love, participants in God's happiness, which is Infinite even in joy! " It does not yet appear what we shall be", St. John comments, "but we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." (1 Jn 3:3)

- The Good Shepherd defends his sheep; he is not like the mercenary who flees when the wolf arrives because he does not care about the sheep. Jesus, with the light of his divine Word and the strength of his sacramental and ecclesial presence, forms our mind, strengthens the will, purifies sentiments, and thus defends and saves us from so many painful and dramatic experiences.

- The Shepherd even offers his life for his sheep. Jesus realized the project of divine Love using his death on the cross! He offered himself on the cross to redeem every individual man created by Love for the eternity of Love!

Finally, the Shepherd desires to increase his flock. Jesus clearly affirms his universal concern: "And I have other sheep, that are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will heed my voice. So there shall be one flock, one shepherd" (Jn 10:16). Jesus wants all men to know him, love him, and follow him. That is why the Good Shepherd keeps calling generous souls to contribute to His plan of salvation.

Every time one undertakes the demanding vocation discernment process, one must consider that he is entrusting himself to this Shepherd, to the Shepherd who knows him perfectly, who gave his life for him, who protects him from every evil, and who has an eternal reward of glory in store for him.

I live you with St. John Paul II's prayer for vocations. Please pray it at home with your family.

We turn to you, Lord, in trust! Son of God, sent by the Father to the men and women of every time and of every part of the earth!

We call upon you through Mary, your Mother and ours: may the Church not lack in vocations, especially those dedicated uniquely to your Kingdom.

Jesus, the only Savior of humanity! We pray to you for our brothers and sisters who have answered "yes" to your call to the priesthood, to the consecrated life and to the missions.

May their lives be renewed daily to become a living Gospel.

Merciful and holy Lord, continue to send new laborers into the harvest of your Kingdom!

Assist those whom you call to follow you in our day; contemplating your face, may they respond with joy to the wondrous mission that you entrust to them for the good of your People and of all men and women.

You who are  $\operatorname{God}$  and  $\operatorname{live}$  and reign with the Father and the  $\operatorname{Holy}$  Spirit, for ever and ever. Amen.

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore, or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by May 31, 2024.
